#### Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta 2022

Chris Burger attended this years event as a spectator and to qualify and obtain his USA Commercial Pilots certificate, his story is below:

# My visit to the Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta 2022

I decided several months ago that I would take the plunge and start actively working towards becoming an instructor. I therefore hopelessly overcommitted myself and bought a Cameron N-105 to start flying regularly.

A strategy I've used in the past to learn some new perspectives is to do an FAA pilot certificate in a new category. I've used this trick on seaplanes, flying boats and gliders. Meeting their standards takes intensive study, something which I seldom make enough time for unless I'm forced to. It also provides some objective feedback on one's standing. Sometimes it is positive, sometimes not so much.

Accordingly, I decided to try to make it to the Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta this year, and to try to get my Commercial certificate at the same time. Flip pointed me in the direction of Beth Wright-Smith, and I started negotiating with her around early September.

Once in Albuquerque, I flew three training flights and a Commercial test. There is no separate instructor rating for balloons under FAA rules, so the Commercial test includes instruction capability. Accordingly, I had to demonstrate instructional technique to my instructor and to the examiner. As I hold a CFII certificate in the USA, I was technically exempted from the instruction tests, but my examiner was having none of it.

I didn't fly in the Fiesta, as the registration of pilots had closed months before. I wasn't entirely unhappy; flying in that unfamiliar situation with 400 other balloons in the sky might have exceeded my ability to stay focused. Instead, I worked as a ground crew member, so I was able to attend all the pilot briefings and stay in touch with happenings.

The weather was lousy throughout the two-week period, including the Fiesta. The storm that wrecked Florida was moving up the east coast, blocking the eastbound circulation and holding the lousy weather in place over New Mexico. I was very disappointed that the gas balloon race was cancelled, I was hoping to use the opportunity to learn about gas balloons.
